With community input I am sure we will come up with even more fun surprises, designs and features that deliver a special space that will keep kids and their families coming back for more.

The importance of this project, not just to Division 1 but the wider South

East Queensland community, who use Underwood Park was why I recently allocated funding from the Division 1 Local Infrastructure Program for the upgrade works.

Mayor's message



We all live in Logan for a reason – whether it's backyards and big dreams, great parks and schools, community spirit or affordability.

Council works with the community to protect what we love and transform areas that still need work.

We've wrapped up 9 weeks of community consultation on Logan Plan – the blueprint for where homes, jobs, industry and community facilities go, and how we keep our community spirit as we grow.

You asked us to cut red tape and make it easier to buy a home, so we've proposed terrace housing, giving first-home buyers and downsizers more options. We also flagged ecotourism opportunities and practical ways to boost our nighttime economy, so our suburbs feel safe and welcoming after dark.

We heard your concerns about flood mapping loud and clear. Your Councillors and I are working with staff on solutions based on your feedback. This is long-term policy, so we need to get it right before the flood maps become permanent. We're starting with changes to the flood portal, and also want to change policies and improve the mapping.

Council will consider every submission, report back to Councillors, and provide a response to every submission through the *Logan Plan - Public Consultation Report 2025*. Parts of the draft may be revised, then the State Government will review it. If approved, Logan Plan is expected to come into effect in late 2026.

Thank you to all who had a say. You're helping shape the city our kids will inherit. If you didn't have a chance to make a submission, I am always open to hearing your ideas and suggestions.

Council will keep refining Logan Plan and our vision for the next 50 years with your help. Logan's future is bright because we're building it together.

Leafy Baroona Park ready for summer fun

Baroona Park in Rochedale South is open again with a fresh new look and upgraded facilities.

The popular tree-lined park in Baroona Street (near the corner with Warrandah Street) now features a range of improvements designed to boost comfort, play and community enjoyment.

The latest upgrades include:

- New playground structure and swing set
- A mini digger for little ones
- New shade sails for sun protection
- A new drinking fountain

The soft-fall surfaces and sand surrounds in the playground have also been replaced or refreshed to ensure a safer play environment.

Park visitors will also notice new seating and a picnic shelter, while bollards have been installed along the street frontage to improve safety and accessibility.

The upgrade to Baroona Park is the latest works by Council across a number of parks in Division 1.

The enhancement of these important community facilities reflects our commitment to creating inclusive, well-equipped public spaces that meet the needs of our growing population.

New turf has been laid in some sections which had worn while some of the high-traffic zones now feature a sturdy but pet-safe new road base.

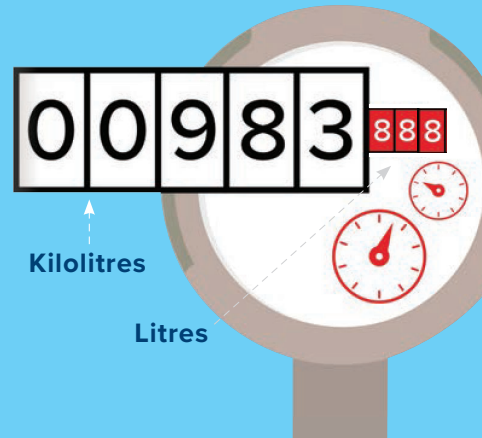
The surrounding gardens have been refreshed with new plants which enhance the park's appeal.

Avoid a leak, take a peek!

1. Turn off all taps and water-using appliances in the property.
2. Is there any movement in the red digits or dials of your water meter? Any movement may indicate a leak.
3. To check – read your meter and record the number, keep your taps and water using appliances off for one hour. Read your meter again, record the second reading. If the reading has changed, this may indicate a leak. We suggest contacting a registered plumber to investigate further.
