Exciting projects help build a bright future

Can you believe it's already been a year since the new term of Council began? Time flies quickly when there's so much happening!

We've had a whirlwind of construction work around Division 12, and it's shaping up to be another exciting and busy year ahead.

First up, a big shout out to BMD Constructions Pty Ltd, our new contractor for the Eagleby Master Drainage Project.

Stage One has been completed which has improved the capacity and resilience of the stormwater drainage network in times of heavy rain. We saw that at work in the severe weather event created by Cyclone Alfred in March.

Stage Two is now underway, with completion scheduled for the end of the year (weather permitting).

A huge 'thank you' goes out to those residents impacted by these important works for your patience during this period.

There's also great news for local sports enthusiasts.

The Eagleby Giants are now enjoying their newly upgraded and returfed football fields at Bishop Park, while Logan Lightning FC have a stunning new clubhouse at Chris Green Park at Beenleigh.

The foundations are now completed for the new Beenleigh Aquatic Centre and we're set to begin construction on a new clubhouse for Twin Rivers Mallet Club at Bedford Park in Eagleby.

There are also exciting times ahead as plans are finalised for the Beenleigh Junior Rugby Club's new clubhouse at Hammel Park, while neighbouring Beenleigh Netball will

benefit from new lighting and court resurfacing.

In a burst of creativity, we're painting the town red (so to speak) to honour our iconic Red Bridge in Logan River Parklands.

The railings of two other bridges in our parks have been painted the same 'Waratah Red' and plans are underway to see what other structures might benefit from a splash of the same paint.

Dragons fired up at new river home

A new dragon boat club has been launched in the Logan River and new members are welcomed.

The Leviathan Dragons plan to set up a base near the boat ramp on the Eagleby side of the Logan River Parklands and hope to be doing training paddles twice a week from the middle of the year.

It is the first dragon boat club in Logan and the 40th registered club to date in Queensland.

Dragonboat enthusiasts are excited to have a local homebase.



'We saw Logan as an untapped market, and with the help of Cr Karen Murphy, we wanted to bring an exciting and new sport to this area,' Leviathan Dragons President and coach Teinanga Wordley says.

Teinanga says Dragon boat racing promotes fitness, teamwork and camaraderie.

The sport involves crews of up to 20 people, who form paddling pairs in a canoe-like boat typically fitted with a carved dragon head and tail.

The Leviathan Dragons welcome paddlers of all ages and abilities (including complete beginners) with a special initial focus on junior paddlers aged 14-plus, youth paddlers aged 18 to 24, and premier paddlers aged 24 to 39.

Mayor's message



I hope you had a safe and happy Easter.

As Cr Murphy wrote, it's been just over a year since your Councillors and I were elected.

It's been an incredibly busy time and the recent public holidays were a good chance to reflect on what's been achieved.

Some great news for Logan is that our new 9-court Indoor Sports Centre will start construction later this year and is due to be finished by 2028. This is a \$140m project funded jointly by the Queensland and Australian Governments and has been identified as a potential event venue at the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games.

We also recently completed an \$80 million upgrade of Loganlea Road.

This project, which included widening the road to 3 lanes in both directions and adding infrastructure, was funded with the support of Jim Chalmers MP as part of the 2022 Federal Election.

Council is now in the middle of finalising the upcoming budget. Your Councillors are focused on finding savings and improving efficiencies across all areas. But just like you, Council is struggling with significant increases in costs for the city – particularly fuel, electricity, insurances and construction.

We're also working on a community consultation project called Transform Logan. During my election campaign, locals said they wanted their Mayor to focus on better long-term planning and an ambitious vision for our city.

This community reference panel has 50 representatives looking at what the next 50 years looks like for Logan. They will share their ideas later in the year.
