For faster service, use this app

When you notice something that needs fixing in our community, I know what matters most to you – getting it reported quickly and without unnecessary delays.

I appreciate the many helpful residents who contact my divisional office when they see an issue but I'm excited to show you an even faster and easier method now available to the whole community.

The Snap Send Solve app is a handy little tool which sends your report

directly to the correct branch in Logan City Council, which can speed up a response.

Snap Send Solve is designed to be convenient. Take a photo, confirm the location and send it from your phone – all in under a minute.

Because your report includes a photograph and precise location, it can help reduce the need for follow-up questions and ensures your issue moves through the system much more smoothly.

Problems can be reported anytime from anywhere because you can use Snap Send Solve as you're going about your day.

It's an easy way to get things fixed faster for you and our local community in Division 3.

Koolan Park renewal now complete

Thank you to nearby residents for their patience during construction and those who contacted my office with questions while works were underway.

Council staff and contractors worked to manage site access, address community concerns and consider the surrounding natural environment during the upgrade.

Koolan Park, in Koolan Crescent, is an important neighbourhood space and I'm proud to see it renewed for another generation of local youngsters and their families to enjoy.

Mayor's message



Did you hear the big news? Amazon Australia is coming to Logan.

A new \$750 million robotics fulfilment

centre will be built at North Maclean, creating more than 2,000 jobs during construction and fit-out, and around 1,000 ongoing jobs for people in our community once it's up and running.

Plans have been revealed for the four-level facility, which is set to cover about 150,000 square metres. That's almost twice the size of Suncorp Stadium.

When it's operating at full capacity, the centre will process more than 125 million packages a year and hold up to 15 million items ready to ship. With advanced AI and automation, that means faster delivery for customers right across Queensland.

The City of Logan is the perfect place for a company like Amazon to invest. We're the youngest and fastest growing city in Queensland, and many in our community want the opportunity to work closer to home.

Local jobs mean less traffic on our roads and more time with family.

I also love how Amazon's robotic warehouses combine technology and people. The technology handles the heavy lifting and repetitive tasks, while people focus on the work that requires skill, judgement and experience.

Your Councillors and I believe it's important that high-paying technology jobs are created right here in Logan. It's something many of you told me you wanted when I was running for Mayor.

Amazon joins big names like Toyota, Culture Kings, LSKD and Little Red Dumpling which have already invested in Logan's bright future. They know what we know. Logan is the place to be.

The Amazon fulfilment centre is expected to be completed in 2028.
