Third Avenue upgrade will improve safety

A major upgrade to Third Avenue through Berrinba and Marsden is set to improve safety, reduce congestion and deliver more reliable travel times for motorists, pedestrians and cyclists.

Logan City Council is upgrading approximately 1.8 kilometres of Third Avenue, along with adjacent sections of Second Avenue and Fourth Avenue, to better manage traffic volumes during peak periods.

Given the size and complexity of the upgrade, construction will occur in stages over the coming years. The project has undergone a detailed scope and cost review with environmental approvals and

construction planning progressing. Logan Water has already delivered some early underground works to support the upgrade.

This upgrade is great news for locals and motorists in Division 5.

Third Avenue will be widened to 2 lanes in each direction including breakdown lanes, turning lanes, cycle lanes and a central median.

Traffic lights will replace the existing busy roundabout at Second Avenue while the nearby Fourth Avenue intersection will be relocated further to the south and also upgraded with traffic lights.

The introduction of these 2 sets of traffic signals will improve traffic flows, reduce congestion and delays and provide safer, more predictable movements for motorists, particularly during peak periods.

Upgraded pedestrian and cycle infrastructure will also support safer travel options for the local community.

Traffic lights on the way for busy local intersection

Construction is well underway on a \$3.5 million upgrade of the intersection of Bumstead Road and Julie Street.

This project, which received funding support from the Australian Government's Black Spot Program, will improve safety for motorists and pedestrians at this busy intersection.

Significant progress has already been made including the clearing of the expanded road easement so the intersection can be aligned with any future upgrades to Bumstead Road.

Underground electrical works also have been done to allow for the installation of traffic lights.

The upgrade is scheduled to be completed by the middle of this year (weather permitting).

To minimise peak hour disruptions, lane closures and reduced speed limits through the work zone will occur between 9 am and 2 pm.

While there may be some short-term inconvenience, these works are a significant investment and will deliver long-term safety improvements for everyone using this intersection.

As part of Council's annual road repair and resurfacing program, Bumstead Road has also been resurfaced between Clarke Road and Chambers Flat Road.

Did you hear the big news? Amazon Australia is coming to Logan.

A new \$750 million robotics fulfilment

centre will be built at North Maclean, creating more than 2,000 jobs during construction and fit-out, and around 1,000 ongoing jobs for people in our community once it's up and running.

Plans have been revealed for the four-level facility, which is set to cover about 150,000 square metres. That's almost twice the size of Suncorp Stadium.

When it's operating at full capacity, the centre will process more than 125 million packages a year and hold up to 15 million items ready to ship. With advanced AI and automation, that means faster delivery for customers right across Queensland.

The City of Logan is the perfect place for a company like Amazon to invest. We're the youngest and fastest growing city in Queensland, and many in our community want the opportunity to work closer to home.

Local jobs mean less traffic on our roads and more time with family.

I also love how Amazon's robotic warehouses combine technology and people. The technology handles the heavy lifting and repetitive tasks, while people focus on the work that requires skill, judgement and experience.

Your Councillors and I believe it's important that high-paying technology jobs are created right here in Logan. It's something many of you told me you wanted when I was running for Mayor.

Amazon joins big names like Toyota, Culture Kings, LSKD and Little Red Dumpling which have already invested in Logan's bright future. They know what we know. Logan is the place to be.

The Amazon fulfilment centre is expected to be completed in 2028.
